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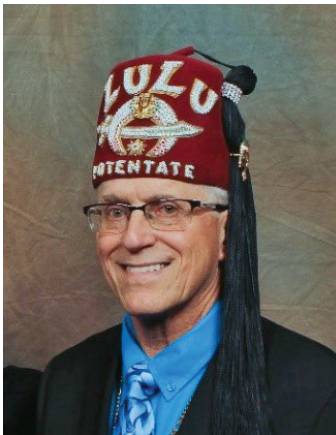

Quaker City-Montco Shrine Club

Eating well and interesting programs are the usual parts of the meetings at Quaker City-Montco Shrine Club. Our meetings over the winter months will be no different. I'm sure everyone will enjoy interesting programs, good food and wonderful company with their fellow Nobles.

The fall started off for the club on Thursday October 4th at one of our usual stomping grounds Giuseppe's of Warminster. People say that ghost and other scary things all happen in October. It is also said that October is the official month of all paranormal activity. In honor of this, our featured speaker for our October's Stated Meeting was Eric Mintel of the Bucks County Paranormal Investigators. Eric's normal job is that of a Jazz musician. Very late at night he chases UFOs and Ghosts. Eric started his presentation with a video of his group's investigations at the historic Inn at Jim Thorpe. Eric gave us a brief history of the Inn. The current Inn was built in 1849, the previous one was

destroyed by a fire and several people perished. The Inn was an architectural gem and social center of the mining town of Mauch Chunk during the 19th century and early 20th century. Many dignitaries including Ulysses S. Grant, President William H. Taft, Buffalo Bill, Thomas Edison and John D. Rockefeller spent the night under its roof. The Inn is supposed to be haunted. In the past, guests have reported unexplained activity in some of the rooms. Past reports of paranormal activity include chairs being turned upside-down while guests slept. TVs have mysteriously turned on and off, objects have moved around, strange orbs and shadows have appeared in photographs, and small children have said they've seen ghosts in their bed. After the video, Eric fielded lots of questions about paranormal activities from the audience. These ranged from questions about UFOs to Big Foot. Several of the members even shared their own ghost stories.

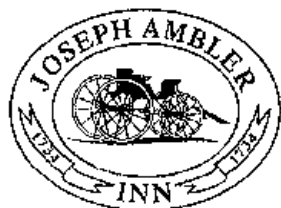

- Encouraging our Committee and the Divan to follow up with newly created LuLu Shriners to see that they have mentors to help them find the fun and camaraderie at LuLu
- An issue at LuLu and all Shriners Temples is the loss of members by suspension due to non-payment of dues. In 2019, two letters were sent to our members who had not paid their dues that year and would be suspended at the end of the year. April 2019, 131 members had not paid their dues. With the encouragement of the two letters from our Potentate, the number dropped to about 70 in October 2019. Our Divan members then personally called these members, bringing the total suspended in 2019 to 64.
- Restoration of membership is a way to come back to LuLu. Significant effort has gone into restoration. Noble Harry F. Speth, Jr. has spent much time and effort, trying to bring back those suspended the previous year. Harry has done this for many, many years. He informed me and the Divan that he will be retiring from this effort at the end of this 2019. Donations to LuLu Shrine – Part II

Part I of this subject is contained in Chapter 41, published in August 2010 and includes items and dollars donated to Lu Lu between 1884 and 2008.

1996-2019: “Tree of Life” – Created in 1996. Donations recognized by inscriptions on Leaves or Rocks, etc., added to the Tree which is displayed in the Lobby. Funds are used to support the Transportation Fund.

2000: “Wheel Chairs” – Two wheelchairs remain in the Coat Room of several donations made in recent years. They may be borrowed for immediate use. Donors remain unknown.

2019: “Train Set” – The set of O gauge Trains includes a Locomotive, a Coal Car and seven Freight Cars on display in the Potentate’s Parlor, was donated by Noble “Rudy Stroh, Jr., a Member of Ill. Sir Jerry Jay’s Lodge #400. After this year, it will remain the property of Lu Lu Shrine.

2009: “Two Statues” – Two Plaster of Paris Statues of Shriners with Fez, located at the Entrance to the Great Hall, were donated by First Lady Jeannette and Ill. Sr Joel Ward (2009). The Bases on which they stand, were donated by Ill. Sir Bob Gold (2014).

2011: “Speakers” – In this year, the “Ladies of the Stage Crew” donated New Speakers for use in the Great Hall.

2017: “Hand Held Microphone” – Noble Richard and Lady Crissy Schultz donated a Hand Held Microphone and a Portable Stand for use in the Great Hall.

2007/2008: First Ladies Sheryl Lamontagne and Kate Adamson donated new Chairs for the Great Hall to replace many that were beyond repair.

2011-2019: Noble Dave Caddick must be thanked for several projects. He and his Crew constantly repair pot-holes and resurface our black top roads. They constructed the new fencing and markings of the parking area outside the Merrymac Room. He is also effective in obtaining Golfers for our Golf Tournament each September. Water and Soda for our Circus and Rodeo have been obtained by Noble Dave at “no charge” the last four years.

2005-2019: “The Wednesday Crew” – Organized in 2005, when help was needed to replace the wooden seats, walkways and stairs of the Outdoor Arena with all aluminum material. Early Volunteers for this task included: Nobles Don Blankley, Ben Baird, Charles Barns, Howard Foster, Fred Simkiss and David Phelps. After this task was completed, the Committee began meeting every Wednesday morning to complete routine maintenance tasks around the Mosque. These routine items included moving its hooked rugs from the Great Hall to the perimeter hallway, replacing ceiling lights in the Great Hall. Noble George Scheerbaum joined the Crew in 2012 and is currently Chairman. In recent years, more Nobles have joined over the years: Kreg Simkiss, Chuck Lankert, Jerry Schmidt, Greg Hass, Paul Feigel, etc. They still meet every Wednesday at 8:30 A.M., pick up their weekly maintenance items and have lunch at Noon. Their services are a valuable asset to Lu Lu’s physical plant. If you have time to volunteer on Wednesday mornings, just show up. “There is always something needs fixing.”

1910-2019: “First Ladies Beautification Projects” – Over the years, several First Ladies donated other items such as Blinds for the Merrymac Room, Flowers and Shrubs for the Round-About at the Front Entrance, Plants in the Lobby.

TO ALL OTHER VOLUNTEERS: This Chapter of LuLu’s History must also recognize and thank the thousands of hours of Volunteer Time by Nobles, Ladies, and Friends of Lu Lu. These Folks have operated our Circus, Rodeo, Hunted House. They have served as Chairman and served on various Committees for Social Events. Also unrecognized are various Nobles and Ladies, who on short notice, serve in the Recorder’s Office on urgent clerical duties. The Mosque, soon reaching 50 years, depends on many, many volunteers. All of our volunteers are greatly appreciated!!
