

I know that we are all looking forward to the tomorrow that are clubs and units can enjoy whatever is their normal. Hopefully in the fall this will be possible.




So, as we think about our tomorrows, what can you do today?


Yom HaShoah

Since I am a Jew, you will have to excuse me for taking this subject very personally. Yom HaShoah literally means Day of the Holocaust. It is observed in Israel on the 27th of Nissan on the Hebrew calendar, on the Gregorian calendar in April or May, in memorial for the more than six million Jews murdered. This included the more than eleven million men. women and children of many religions, sexual orientations, philosophies (specifically including Masons) and people who were not "perfect" physically or mentally murdered by the Nazis and their sympathizers. Most Jews personally know of families and friends who were murdered or who survived the brutality. Quaker City Montco Shrine Club has a speaker each year, around this time of the year, with a program about the Holocaust.

This year, with assistance from Helen Kirshenbaum, Director of the Esther Raab Holocaust Museum and Goodwin Education Center, we were honored by a presentation from a Holocaust Survivor, Eva Weiner. She was only ten months old when her parents boarded, with her, the MS St. Louis in Hamburg, Germany. The destination for the 937 passengers was Havana Cuba. You may know of the book or film: Voyage of the Damned. This story of the journey of the St Louis from May to June 1939, is heart wrenching for those on board, but the impact of the journey was felt by Jews murdered during the entire period of the Second World War. When the St Louis arrived in Cuba, the passengers were refused entry, even though they held legal Cuban visas. The Joint Distribution Committee (a Jewish agency) tried to obtain permission for the passengers to enter any country in South and Central America, the United States, Canada, as well as the countries of Europe. Belgium, England, France, and Holland were the only countries that would accept the passengers. FDR turned his back on the Jews on the St Louis. In 2012, the U.S. State Department officially apologizing for the United State government's recalcitrance at that time.

Like most children, I am often coming to the question of Why! Why and how did this journey of the St Louis have such a momentous impact on the Jews of Europe during WWII. The answer is simple and cruel. The Nazis wanted to demonstrate to the world that no country wanted the Jews to survive. The Nazis pressured all the countries that the St Louis approached to turn it way. This was a purposeful plan that directly led to what the Nazis called The Final Solution. The St Louis gave the Nazis the moral imperative, from their twisted morality, to rid the world of the unwanted Jews. The Nazis concluded that neither its friends nor foes wanted the Jews to exist. The Nazis were doing the job of garbage collector for humanity since they considered Jews to be sub-human.

With the experience of the St Louis, Eva Weiner's objective is to teach the children of the world: Never Again, for any race, religion, nationality, philosophy, or human condition.

Spine procedure helps patient get back into the swing of things



For many unknown reasons, scoliosis predominantly affects teenage girls, but many teenage boys are also diagnosed with the condition each year. Like many others, Seth's family sought help through a family friend, who is a chiropractor, when he received his diagnosis. Seth's curve was at about 25 degrees when he started going to the chiropractor, and had progressed to 40 degrees when they realized the treatments were not working a couple of months later.

Seth's chiropractor suggested that he consider surgery and directed his family to a Facebook Group, where they learned about Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia and its special vertebral body tethering (VBT) procedure as an alternative to spinal fusion.

Seth had his initial appointment with Joshua Pahys, M.D., in January 2017, and was scheduled for surgery in March. By this time, Seth's curve had progressed to 58 degrees.

"Seth and his family were incredibly tough and resilient through the entire process," said Dr. Pahys. "It is certainly not easy for many families to comprehend surgery on an otherwise healthy and active teenager. Seth's hard work and positive attitude helped him bounce back speedily to playing golf. He has far exceeded our expectations, and hope he continues to progress in his golfing career."

Seth was nervous that having surgery would affect his ability to play golf, and is happy that having surgery did not change too many things for him, "I was worried that my stroke would be

slower and perhaps not as strong," said Seth. "But really, I am right about where I was and able to compete with others in my age group."

Today, Seth plays on his high school golf team and competes in several tournaments throughout the year. He is hoping to get a golf scholarship to college, where he plans to study finance.

"I want to be a finance professional, but I would also love to be a professional golfer, too," said Seth. "Thanks to Shriners Hospitals, anything can be possible now."

In the past I've encouraged everyone to be an ambassador for the hospital by getting our message out to the general public. I can tell you from my own perspective that prior to becoming a Shriner, I really had no idea what the mission of being a Shriner was all about. I passed the former Shriners Hospital on Roosevelt Blvd. every day for many years on my way to work and never gave it a second thought. It wasn't until I became a nursing student and went to the hospital as a part of my clinical rotation, that I truly found out the daily miracles that were taking place within those walls. Thankfully, over the past several years our message is being seen and heard through television commercials. This has helped to increase visibility but there are still many, including myself, who tune out those commercials.

On numerous occasions since becoming a member of the Board of Governors, many of my Shriner friends have asked me questions about how and who to contact if they knew of a child in need of our care. Some of their questions were related to eligibility for treatment (patient age and condition). The easy answer to this question is to direct them to Shriners Hospital. In the past children needed to have a Shriner recommendation to begin the treatment process, however, that is no longer a requirement. A call to inquire is all that is needed to start the process. The next time you are at the Shrine Temple, pick up a brochure that will provide explicit details to expediting a referral.

We'd like to welcome the 12 new Nobles who were created at the virtual Ceremonial, March 13, 2021; may your journey through Shrinedom, be interesting, enjoyable, a learning experience and fun. As is said very often; "you get out of your Fraternal experience what you put into it". An extra special welcome to new March 2021 Noble Dominic Pergolino and Lady Margo who joined the Shepherds and are already qualified!

Our Unit, The Shepherds Unit presently has 13 qualified Noble drivers who are tasked with transporting 'our children' from locations within LuLu's Oasis to Shriners Hospital Philadelphia for their scheduled appointments; maybe to and from their homes, a local hotel or even Philadelphia International Airport or even 230th Street Station. We are also 12 other Nobles and Ladies who act as 2nd seaters or 'shotgun', as all transportations MUST have 2 qualified adults; at least one being a Shriner. LuLu's Oasis includes Philadelphia, Delaware, Montgomery, Bucks, Chester, and portions of Lancaster Counties.

To qualify, a Noble or Shrine Lady must be a member of the Shepherds Unit and have a current PA or NJ Driver's License; have or get a PA State Police Criminal

Our present van is a Mercedes Benz 'Sprinter' with a wheelchair lift to transport wheelchair bound or ambulatory children and below is a list of our transports.

- Jan 2021 = 28 runs, 250 m/h
- Feb 2021 = 27 runs, 164 m/h
- Mar 2021 = 27 runs, 202 m/h
- April 2021 = 35 runs, 180 m/h
- May 2021 = 51 runs, 431 m/h (as of this writing)

As I mentioned in our January article, we were seeking funds to purchase a 2nd van as we have experienced some days of multiple transports. Well, I'm happy to say the purchase of a second van is underway. With a MOST generous donation from Lodge 9 of \$70,000, The Shepherds via LuLu have ordered a new-build unit from Wolfington Body Company, which should be in service by mid-summer. A big Thank You to Wolfington also, for arranging a low-cost lease of another Unit while our new van is built.

Thank You for donations towards the new van also goes out to Concordia Lodge 67 (\$7,000), Palestine-Roxborough Lodge 135 (\$500), Corinthian Chapter 13 O.E.S. (\$500) and LuLu Yacht Club (\$200).

COVID-19 VIRUS – PART V

COVID-19 Vaccines guiding principles for fully vaccinated people has been updated:

- Indoor and outdoor activities pose minimal risk to fully vaccinated people
- Fully vaccinated people have a reduced risk of transmitting SARS-CoV-2 to unvaccinated people
- Fully vaccinated people should still get tested if experiencing COVID-19 symptoms
- Fully vaccinated travelers are less likely to get and spread SARS-CoV-2 and can now travel at low risk to themselves within the US

Currently, COVID-19 cases and deaths in the United States have dropped to their lowest levels in nearly a year. The number of people vaccinated has risen significantly:

TOTAL VACCINE DOSES:

Delivered: 366,316,945 Administered: 294,928,850



As of this date, 50.5% of the total population has received at least one dose of the vaccine and 40.7% of the total population is fully vaccinated. There are currently an estimated 33,079,000 cases currently in the US and approximately 591,265 reported deaths. Children 12 years and older are now eligible to get vaccinated against COVID-19. Currently, the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine is the only on available to children 12 years and older.

May 1st, 2021 – Philadelphia Eagles selected 9 players in the 2021 NFL Draft. With their first-round selection (number 10 overall) the team selected DeVonta Smith, wide receiver, University of Alabama.

May 8th, 2021 – Some Major League Baseball teams lift capacity limits for vaccinated fans.

May 19th, 2021 – NCAA allows full capacity for collegiate softball and baseball postseasons.

May 20th, 2021 – Shriners Hospitals for Children names new title sponsor for Entertainment & Sports Programing Network (ESPN) Events' Charleston Classic. The two sides have agreed to a four-year pact to host this college basketball tournament that will be hosted in Charleston, South Carolina.

May 25th, 2021 – The Philadelphia Phillies placed outfielder Bryce Harper on the injured list. Harper is batting .274 this season with 7 home runs. The Phil's are 25-29 and 3rd place in the National League East Division.

May 30th, 2021 – Indianapolis 500 became the largest attended sporting event since the pandemic began, with a reduced-capacity sellout crowd of 135,000 fans (which was 40% of venue capacity). At full capacity, the speedway is the largest sporting facility in the world with more than 250,000 grand-stand seats and the ability to host close to 400,000 on race day throughout the entire property.

Alternative Ways of Brewing

Do you remember Zima? You're fortunate if you don't. It was a "malternative," (that is, alternative to beer) alcoholic drink that was wildly popular circa 1995. I'll shamefully admit, I was a fan at the time. It was a clear malt beverage whose flavor is described as somewhere between Diet Sprite and chewing on aluminum foil.

When I was younger, thinner, and generally more fun to be around, I used to go to nightclubs. One club offered Zima with a shot of Chambord (a raspberry liqueur) in it to make it more palatable. It was hip, it was cool, it was overpriced, and it wasn't boring old beer.

Zima was trying to compete with wine coolers and ride the clear beverage fad at the same time. We had Bartles & Jaymes and Crystal Pepsi and nonsense like that back then. And Coors, who made Zima, desperately tried to market their product to men. But it quickly became the butt of jokes by late night talk shows as being a "girly drink." It got really popular, really fast, and then died within about 2 years.

But Coors kept making it for decades with reduced distribution and marketing. The reason was because of the manufacturing process and their market positioning. Their dirty secret: Zima was made from leftover beer! They would run old beer that they couldn't sell through charcoal filters to strip out all the color and flavor, add a little artificial citrus flavor, bottle, re-carbonate, and then sell it at a premium. It's like a pig farmer figured out that they could sell scrapple for twice the price of ham if they just repackaged it as "Pork Pâté." That was Zima.

These folks were brilliant pioneers. Now-a-days, we have White Claw, Truly, Smirnoff Ice, and a host of other hard seltzer, non-beer products. Zima wasn't bad, it was just way ahead of its time.

Now for something completely different: Guinness.

Guinness Foreign Extra Stout beer has a rather

unusual process to it as well. Back in Ireland, they make the wort. Wort is unfermented beer, made from water, malted (and sometimes unmalted) barley, and perhaps other adjuncts, grains, and hops. They take the wort, reduce it down to a syrup, and ship it all over the world. Then, the syrup gets mixed with local water and fermented to make beer for bottling. So it will taste different depending on where you tilt a pint of the black stuff. The process is similar to Coca-Cola or Pepsi who make syrup in a central location and then ship to local bottlers.

Another oddity about Guinness is the way it gets served. They use a mix of carbon dioxide and nitrogen (most beers are tapped with just CO2) and push the brew through a metal plate with small holes. This makes the process of pouring a pint a wee bit more time consuming but it produces the creamy, silky head and mouth feel which is indicative of Guinness. Fun fact: Guinness hired a statistician in 1899 to monitor and analyze their factory processes and his techniques are still used to this day! Not just in brewing, but the entire field of statistics!

People are doing all kinds of wacky things to make beverages these days. And the Brewmeisters Taproom is looking to taste them! Well, maybe not the gross ones (I had a pickle beer recently, which I wouldn't force upon my worst enemy). We're looking for charter members and regular members and ladies are welcome.
