Temples that are not doing so well. I heard a bunch of stories about how some were forced to sell their buildings, how some sales went bad, and how others were sorry they did. The overall fact that became apparent was that they did not run their facility as a business, nor did they consider it an asset. Seems like, for once, we at LuLu are ahead of that curve.

One common theme was that when we all had greater numbers, we all had more income in the form of dues revenue. The point was made that Shrine has now suffered 46 straight years of membership decline. Another point was made that "always doing what we always did has not worked out so well". It was interesting to hear an Imperial Officer state what we already knew, "there are two sides to a Shrine Center.

How this all works is pretty invisible to the general membership, and not because anything is hidden. Just come out to a Finance Advisory Committee meeting and maybe a Divan meeting. There are those members that feel the Shrine should run more like a fraternity, but with the exception of dues, they are not paying any of the bills. A hot topic was paying rent for using the facility. Let me be clear that this was discussed at the Divan level and decided clearly and fairly.

To reiterate, units are assigned meeting rooms. Some are individual while others are shared. We are re-allocating some of the rooms to accommodate our more active units. Unlike Blue Lodges that meet either at One North Broad Street or any Hall Association building, all are provided free of charge. No rent or no charge for electricity. The only requirement is that they maintain their individual rooms by keeping them clean, organized, and free of accumulated trash.

Now some have a need to use Room 5 or our Merrymac Room for their meetings. Absolutely no problem providing that the rooms are available, the unit has submitted a Special Activity Form stating the when, what, and how, and it is approved. There is no charge providing the room is left as it was found. This means that they setup what they need to hold their meeting and afterward, break it down. They are also required to empty their trash. We went further to stipulate that we (LuLu) would be happy to setup, breakdown, deal with the trash, sweep and mop. Whatever they need, understanding there would be a charge if we use workers on the clock.

It was also discussed within the Divan to consider any unit or club wanting to use any part of the facility for a fundraiser. It seems fair that if the unit or club is charging admission that LuLu be entitled to cover its costs as well. Recently, this arrangement was made with the Motor Unit when they hosted a Super Bowl Party. They are planning on doing it again next

I know the whole Divan is committed to making sure we have the funds to make sure the building is maintained. This is just one area of concern and I as I stated others will be addressed in future articles.

Finally, I want to ensure our membership that the number one goal is to remain transparent with our financials and have procedures in place to ensure no one officer has total control of the funds. year, so it worked out for everyone. Going forward, hopefully, our Nobility will agree that this is fair policy.

You might be surprised to hear that Imperial really expected the dues income would cover most of the operating costs of the Temple so that with one or two major fundraisers everything works out. This might have been true back in the early 70's but not so much today. One would bet this is why many Temples have fallen into hard times. It was easy with lots of members! Back then dues were \$40 and with 8,000 members, income was \$320,000. Jump forward to today and the expected dues income from \$100/member works out to under \$90,000. Ask yourself what would be needed to make the 1970's \$320,000.00 value today? Clearly, we needed to explore other techniques to raise the funding required. Our Temple accomplished this by selling off a portion of its land, investing the principle, and using a portion of the income for operations. We have also enjoyed increased rentals using the building as an asset.

It's not easy by any means as our club is more than just a Tree House. At the end of the day, we can be grateful that we were able to keep and maintain our unique home and share it with our members. Again, there is a very thin line between the fraternal side and the business side. The real challenge is being fair to everyone whether they know it or not.

I look forward to seeing you at one of our events or stop by the office and say hello.

Spring and summer are approaching and with a bit of luck we will have better attendance at Shrine events




and increase our membership numbers. The Motor Unit has picked up a few new members and hopefully

Welcoming Guest Speaker Randi Stooper

On Thursday, March 31,2022, Quaker City-Monto Shrine Club had the honor and pleasure of hosting our guest speaker Randi Stoopler and an audience of nearly 50 guests. Randi is a representative of the Raab/Goodwin Holocaust Center and the granddaughter of two concentration camp survivors. Her grandfather and best friend, Simon Birmbaum, was born in Czestochowa, Poland. This town in eastern Poland was very near the German border. It was around 1939 that the Nazi government of Germany invaded Poland and decided to imprison Jews, use them for free labor and ultimately eliminate them. Her powerful presentation included pictures of the town and the work/extermination camps her grandfather experienced.

He told her of the conditions he endured under Nazi rule. If your labor was of value to the camp there was a good chance you would survive, otherwise you would disappear. For some inmates there were extended periods of time where there was nothing to do but experience hunger, sit and wait. The conditions inmates had to endure were cruel; ten people to a bunk, no pillows or blankets and two meals a day to divide among your bunk mates. The meals consisted of soup in the morning and a loaf of bread in the afternoon.

After allied liberation, Simon and the few surviving members of his extended family lived in several countries striving to earn a living. Seeking a better life, he lived in Germany, immigrated to Israel and ultimately to the United States. With most of his family gone Simon focused his life on his grandchild Randi and earning a living. Social life after liberation was generally confined to events with other camp survivors.

After answering audience questions about such topics as reparations to victims of the holocaust were answered, the guests retired to a sumptuous array of desserts and a selection of hot and cold drinks. There were of course many conversations about the presentation and personal family experiences. The Club is of course grateful to LuLu Shrine for the use of the Merrymac Room.



She has a beautiful singing voice, is part of the school choir, paints by mouth and enjoys sharing her story as a Patient Ambassador. Belinda was recently featured in a Shriners Children's commercial.

Belinda and all of the patients at the hospital are thankful for the support that the David S. Rocchino Family Foundation has given. Their donation of \$25,000 enabled them the opportunity to represent something special at the hospital and name the pre-op bay in the pre-anesthesia care unit after their foundation.

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
