


Don't be shy! Get up and go to LuLu!



Hospital Rounds

Spring At our Board of Governors meeting in May, we were presented with updated information related to the Shriners Children's Philadelphia 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment. I found it very enlightening in many ways and thought I would give you a brief synopsis of its contents.

Shriners Children's Philadelphia is a 49-bed pediatric orthopedic hospital. Additionally, it is also a teaching hospital and supports the educational needs of medical, nursing, physical, occupational, and speech therapy students as well as radiology resident/students.

There are approximately 70 conditions treated in our hospital ranging from acute fractures to vertical talus. If you know of a child who may need our services and have a question related to any orthopedic condition, spinal cord injury or cleft lip and palate, do not hesitate in reaching out to the hospital to inquire about the child's condition.

Children are not just small adults; their bones heal faster than that of an adult. This means a child with an injury should see an experienced pediatric orthopedic specialist as quickly as possible. Children will receive fracture care, which may include reduction, surgery, casting, post fracture follow-up and physical or occupational therapy. It's important to note that our hospital clinic is also supported by an additional clinic located at Doylestown Hospital. The Doylestown location is now a full-service site for evaluations and follow-up care for all conditions treated at our main location in Philadelphia.

Research is one of the cornerstones of Shriners Children's Philadelphia. Our in-house research teams include internationally renowned experts whose discoveries have changed treatment methodologies and improved the lives of countless children affected by debilitating conditions.

During 2021, patients utilizing Shriners Children's

Looking forward to seeing you on the helm in open waters this summer season.



Spirits Tasting Event

"It went down warm and was an absolute pleasure to taste!" This is the best way to express how wonderful the joint Quaker City/Activities Club Spirits Tasting Event was experienced. On Sunday afternoon, May 29th, at Mermaid Spirits in Huntingdon Valley, PA, the two groups gathered to not only enjoy each other's company, but to experience the tasting of Rum, Cinnamon Whisky, Limoncello, Honey Whiskey, Wine, Port Whisky and so many other wonderful flavors. Not only did the Nobles and Ladies get to try a nice size sampling of each flavor, but the establishment provided some snacks for the attendees. There were brick oven fire roasted tomato pies and soft pretzel bites for everyone to enjoy.

The afternoon started with our group divided into two. One group went to see how the distillation process takes place in the back. The owner of Mermaid Spirits, David Johnston, Ph.D. and Master Distiller, who is also a chemist, explained how various rums and whiskies are created. David explained how the different alcohols are stored in different types of barrels — some charred oak, some aged and some fresh barrels. David also explained how bourbons are exclusively made in the USA and typically made only in Tennessee. He also explained about his business and how he started the Mermaid Spirits about five years ago.

While the first group was getting an education of the distillation process in the back of the store, the other


Flag Retirement Ceremony


