LuLu Pig Roast and Picnic



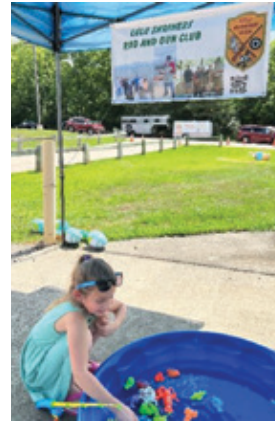
