
option for our workers before we go outside to fill the need.





THE HISTORY OF THE SHRINE & LULU TEMPLE – 16 CHAPTER CVI (106)

Spotlight on the former Montgomery County and Quaker City Shrine Clubs.

The Montgomery County Shrine Club was organized in 1955. Noble J. Weber Kriebel became the clubs first President. In 1959, Bro. Kriebel (affectionally known as "Web") would be elected LuLu's 24th Potentate.

Membership was open to all Nobles in good standing with the desire to promote good fellowship, deepen fraternal bonds and participate in upstanding charitable activities.

Meetings were regularly reserved inside various restaurants within the Montgomery County area. Pictured below are officers of the 1976 club.



The Constitution meeting of the Quaker City Shrine Club was held on September 3, 1959, at the Sylvania Hotel in Philadelphia. The first President was Noble David Marder. The Charter was signed by 142 Nobles who became Charter members.

During the first year of the club, it took in 245 members, participated in every major program of LuLu Temple, sponsored two parties for the Children of the Shriners Hospital and participated in the annual Shriners Circus.

By 1979, the 17th anniversary of the club, their

membership reached almost 600 Shriners. The monthly publication "The Quill" has received awards for its excellent content. Pictured to the right are officers of the 1976 club.



These two clubs went on to be merged into the Quaker City – Montco Shrine Club.



Since the merger the club has continued to do great things and they remain active in the Shrine. Of recent note, among other accolades, they were named Club of the Year in 2018 and 2020, respectively.
