Recorder's Ramblings

First, I hope everyone enjoyed the holidays and started this new year healthy and happy. Secondly, I would like to thank all of you for your trust and continued support by electing me to another term as Recorder. And thirdly, my congratulations to all those men who were elected to positions of

leadership in our Temple, especially our new Potentate, Illustrious Sir Paul J. Feigel, Sr. Together we can keep LuLu moving in a positive direction.

Finally, there seems to be some confusion as to who actually holds ownership over club and unit monies. Especially the procedure to follow when the time comes to close a body and liquidate the funds. The rest of this article is devoted to shining some light on this topic.

All clubs and units operate under the "will and pleasure" of the Potentate. This has been true since Shrine was formed. All clubs and units are covered under the Temple's insurance policies as well. Be aware that all units use the Temples EIN number and file as a part of the Temple's consolidated 990. The clubs operate in a similar fashion but hold their own

EIN and file under the 990 subordinate group return. In both cases and with few exceptions, all funds are the property of the Temple, or to be more precise, the property of the LuLu Nobility.

Now, I am not saying that if and when a club or unit dissolves the members cannot have a voice in the disposition of funds. I am saying that once they have held a vote at a called for meeting the minutes must be sent to the Recorder along with the request from the members of that body. At that time, the funds from the dissolved unit would also come to the Temple. The Recorder will take the request to the Potentate for his approval, and once approved it will go to the Nobility for their approval. After all, since all funds belong to the overall Nobility, their voice must also be heard. Accordingly, a motion to accept the dissolution and distribute the funds of said club or unit would be brought to the floor at a business meeting. If approved by a majority vote, the funds would be distributed. If the motion failed, the funds would stay with the Temple.

This is the procedure that needs to be followed in order to protect all the members of the Temple. Anything else goes against Shrine Law and could bring severe consequences to the person or persons involved in a unintentional but wrongful act.




December 18th was our Ladies Holiday Party honoring our ladies! January 14, 2024, is our Installation
