Membership

The definition above is from Dictionary.com. It could be from any number of dictionaries actually; this is just the one that popped up on my search. Unfortunately, any way you search it, the word has become a rare one over the past several decades.

According to the research done by Robert D. Putnam, author of the book: "Bowling Alone", our society has been experiencing a serious decline in membership in Societies and Clubs since the 1960's. What once was a badge of honor among our parents and grandparents, has deteriorated into a chaotic mess derided by the past several generations who have become complacent to the benefits of being linked together with like-minded others in a formal construct of in-person meetings and events designed to further our relationships with each other, society and the world in general. The internet has become the method of choice for social engagement, allowing anonymous banter and criticism without social consequence as one can just rename themselves on a whim, or choose to slink into oblivion by cancelling or blocking that which they find distasteful. We have become a society of bullies and over- sensitive misfits who get their feelings hurt by the inanest subjects and politics. Sometimes to the point of destroying entire families in its wake.

In Freemasonry in general and our Shrine in particular, there was a time not long ago where you could witness entire families from generation to generation who would follow each other along our path of enlightenment and brotherhood cheerfully, and with excitement at the prospect of getting involved for the greater good. Masons took their oaths and obligations seriously and followed through. The only competition one would have, was to out-do each other with how we could accomplish great things within our fraternity. We worked together as a team to get things done. There was a time when Past Officers would go out of their way to help their successors succeed. Divans and Cabiri supported their Potentates, and Masons would help in worthy endeavors selflessly without hesitation.


Where is our passion for our Fraternity? Fewer people show up to meetings, and events. We criticize other brothers or Nobles, or we hear cries of "things are too expensive" and yet, many of our members extol each other about their latest exotic vacation or purchase. Since when has our Shrine been about the "cost of participation?" What about the enormous cost of lack of commitment? The lack of support of our fellows! As one Noble has said to me more than once..."We are experiencing the high cost of low expectations".

It was not that long ago that we had contingents of Patrol Members, Shepherds, Clubs and Units galore. We had a String Band, Oriental Band, and a Concert Band. We established the first Legion of Honor, the first Mounted Guard in Shrinedom...at LuLu! At one point we had well over 8,000 members in our Shrine. Clubs were packed with members eager to get together and spend time with each other and make things happen.

I was asked to help by taking an appointment and serve as Member Chair this year. I do not take these requests lightly. So, when I was asked how many new members I thought we should strive for, I took a long look at our membership over the past several years. To say I was alarmed would be an understatement. We are losing more members than we bring in each year to such an extent that we are in peril. From the Black Camel, to apathy, to not engaging interested Masons and new members, our numbers are slipping away at an alarming rate. Last year we had less than 20 new members join LuLu. We lost over twice that number. How can this be?

My answer to the question was: 100 new members for 2025.

We are a part of Shrine History. We have made a difference with our Shepherds, our events, our participation on the Shriners Children's board not to mention the numerous parades, and awards bestowed upon us over more than a century of service to the Shrine and thousands of children! This should be an easy number to achieve. **It's only 10 members per month** and yet we are struggling. So, the next (continued on page 21)





Hospital Rounds

Hello brother Shriners, family and friends. Here we are in the middle of 2025. It seems like yesterday that I was writing an article for the January /February Fez.

Last week Jacquie and I transported Jayden Kavetski , his nurse and his Grandmother to the hospital for a Doctor's visit and his occupational therapy. When we picked him up at his house, he had a painting that his nurse Ruth and Jayden created. The painting was a donation to the Hospital for an auction that was being held for Operation Smile.

The picture to the right was taken in the lobby before he presented it to the hospital.

Jayden is an amazing young man who was paralyzed in a car accident a couple years ago. He is a truly amazing young man with a heart of gold.


Over this past weekend Stephanie Stahl from CBS news ran an article about our Motion analysis lab. It was very informative and if you ever get chance to tour the hospital you should stop into the Motion Analysis lab to see it for yourself.

Motion analysis is a technology that uses data to help analyze how a child walks and moves, Shriners Children's uses high-speed cameras, reflective markers, force platforms and muscle sensors to to record a child's movement patterns. The data is then analyzed using computer-generated imagery similar to what you might see in a video game, to model the child's gait and allow doctors to compare it to a patient without gait differences. Shriners Children's Corporate



Director of Motion Analysis Centers Ross Chafetz, PT, D.P.T., Ph.D., MPH, said the technology allows doctors to pinpoint exactly where the problem is and more accurately determine the best course of treatment.

"We are the largest network of motion analysis centers in the world under one department," said Ross Chafetz, corporate doctor of motion analysis centers for Shriners Children's.







Jackson's Limb Difference

Every year, four of every 10,000 babies will be born with an upper limb deficiency.

When Stephanie and her husband went to their OBGYN for their 16-week ultrasound appointment, doctors were unable to find their son's left forearm and hand. When Jackson was born, he was diagnosed with left upper extremity transverse deficiency, a congenital condition where a portion of the arm does not develop while in utero.

After a referral from his pediatrician when Jackson was just 8 months old, he and his family came to Shriners Children's Philadelphia for their first appointment with Dan Zlotolow, M.D., pediatric orthopedic surgeon, whom he now visits for yearly checkups.



Now 7, Jackson recently began asking his family if he could

have a prosthetic arm to help with his daily activities and functions. After fittings and measurements earlier this year, he received his first prosthetic arm, which is imprinted with his favorite sports team, the Philadelphia Phillies. Jackson's arm was custom-made by the staff in the Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services (POPS) department, and he will return for fittings and adjustments as he continues to grow.

"A prosthetic device has allowed him to feel like a regular kid, improve socialization and enhance his daily functions." - Dan Zlotolow, M.D.,

In addition to appointments with Dr. Zlotolow and the POPS department staff, Jackson periodically works with the occupational therapy team to ensure fit and mastery of his prosthetic arm.

"Jackson is an independent kid! He can do everything on his own, but was ready to explore the world of prosthetics. He chose the Phillies design and was so excited to show it off and try it! Since delivery, he has progressed so much! He can already put it on and remove it without help and was able to easily incorporate it (and win!) a game of Connect 4 with me," said Jaclyn Miley, MS, OTR/L.



"Mrs. Jackie is the sweetest girl ever," said Jackson.

Stephanie, Jackson's mom, is thankful for the amazing care and great support her family receives. They are also incredibly thankful to Dennis, a Shriner from Rajah Shriners in Reading, Pennsylvania, and his wife, Louann, for transporting them to and from appointments.

When Jackson is not in Philadelphia for appointments, he enjoys cheering on Philadelphia sports teams, watching WWE, fishing with his dad, swimming and playing video games.
