Recorder's Ramblings

Autumn is here and the leaves are turning and falling. Winter will follow as you receive this — the last Fez issue for 2025. Our Charity Golf Outing and the Fin-Raise are behind us. We should all be proud of the funds raised, through our collective efforts, for our Philadelphia hospital and

be even prouder to be a part of the most amazing hospital system anywhere.

Now we are gearing up for the annual Ladies' Luncheon honoring First Lady Dana Feldsher. You don't want to miss this one as there will be a female comedian. Following that is the FEZtival of Trees. The year is winding down, but our activities are still going strong. Our December holiday parties will give us plenty to do. While we are unsure about a New Year's Eve Party (it might be interesting seeing Hilary, our Chief Rabban, in a diaper, ringing in the New Year) the 2026 Club and Unit will be here before you know it.

I am growing weary of being the "bad guy." What do I mean? Well, part of the job of the Recorder and Facilities Manager is to point out shortfalls and provide facts. I'll admit that my delivery is not always soft, however, the acceptance of that information needs work too. Let's agree that this is a joint effort to have LuLu succeed.

Units and Unit Rooms — The Unit Rooms were created for the Units that supported the Temple in parades as

the wages of their labor. They even held their meetings there back when our numbers were, well, a lot larger than they are now. Let's move on. LuLu is not going to take your room away. We're asking that you keep it neat and clean at your own expense and through your own hard work. Yes, we did some necessary upgrades, and we appreciated any help that was given, be it work done or money contributed. We are not asking you for help with building expenses, however, it has not gone unnoticed that some Units have funds to donate while complaining about a small charge to use another part of the Shrine. At the end of the day, everything belongs to all of us.

Income — In our Temple, like many others, we have four (4) sources of income. They are 1- Dues, 2- Rentals, 3- Investment Income, and 4- Fundraising events. It should not be a surprise that we depend on all four for financing a positive year.

Dues — The last dues increase was 2017 when we completed the \$5 per year for five years project. That year we had about 1,100 members paying \$100 to LuLu, so the dues revenue was \$110,000. When the building was completed, we had 7,500 members paying \$45 representing \$337,500 in dues revenue. Today with 600 members we collect \$60,000 in dues, a \$50,000 annual shortfall from 2017 alone. I suggested we consider a \$20 increase which might raise another \$12,000, but some are concerned that we might lose more than the increase would generate. It is all about the value of membership. What is the value of belonging to an organization supporting the most amazing care anywhere?

We should all thank our Potentate and Divan for a productive year with a proud list of accomplishments including our new digital sign, the driveways and parking lot renovation, the tree lights, and the Knauth Pavilion. We look forward to seeing what Hilary has planned for 2026 as he takes the helm.

In the meantime, on behalf of myself, Lady Cheryl and all the office staff, we wish you and yours a Happy Thanksgiving, a joyous holiday season and a healthy New Year. If you happen to be at the Shrine on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday, stop by the office and say hello.

Hospital Rounds

I just can't believe we are almost 85% through the year and the Holidays are not far off. It seems like just last week I was putting my first article together for the Fez. Wow, how time flies.

Our Doctors and technicians completed another very successful clinic in Puerto Rico again in early September with over 350 patients being treated. Guess what, they are scheduled to return in November. Thank you and congratulations to all our staff for continuing to perform so valiantly and diligently at each of these clinics. It sounds like the next one should be a very busy clinic as well because the number of patients keeps climbing with each visit.

There have been a lot of changes at the hospital since my last article. The check in that previously took place on the fourth floor has been moved down to the lobby. So, things do look a little different now. This does seem to make the check in process easier and much faster with everything in one place. This is also more secure for everyone in the facility since no one can just go up into the building without having been properly checked in.

The new radiology/ Seimens Multitron Rax project on the fourth floor is under way. The room is being modified to accommodate the new equipment since it is quite a bit larger than the existing EOS machine. For those who are not aware, this machine is a replacement for the EOS machine that we are presently using. The new machine has the most up to date technology and is better suited for patients who cannot stand as was required in the EOS machine.

For our Shepherd drivers, you should be noticing that the lines are being painted in the garage, which will make it much easier to back the vans into the proper parking spaces. I know this is a project that has been in the works for some time.

On Thursday September 18th the Fin-Raise for Love took place at the Adventure Aquarium in Camden,

NJ. and it was fantastic. The event was sold out and everyone had a wonderful time. There were at least five patient ambassadors in attendance, and I know they were having the time of their lives. For those of you who are not aware, this is the only major fund-raising event that the Philadelphia Hospital puts on to raise money. The goal for this year was \$500,000. When Terry Diamond was in the process of announcing the total that had been collected thus far, which was \$670,000. She barely made the announcement when she was handed a check for \$41,000. This brought the total to \$711,000. So, this year the Fin Raise was a huge success. Obviously that total does not include any monies that were collected for the silent auction or the raffle that took place.

In addition to the Fin Raise for Love, there are two other events that take place in the LuLu oasis to help raise money for the Hospital. The Yachtstock RiverJam, that is held annually at the West End Boat Club in Essington, PA. This event is run by George Spicer and approximately half of the proceeds go to Shriners Children's Philadelphia. The LuLu Charity Golf Outing which is run by Noble Dave Caddick was held again at LuLu Country Club in Glenside, PA. This is the largest charity fundraising event held for LuLu Shriners, for the Philadelphia Hospital.

I would like to wish all of our Nobles, their Ladies their families and our entire Shrine family a very happy, healthy and safe holiday season.

ELECTION REGULATIONS

§ 325.11 Election Regulations.

- (a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a résumé consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) **Expenditures Prohibited.** The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) **Violation.** For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) **Notice.** At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.





Each category requires certain attention to be safe. These are things, and many more we will be discussing at our business meetings.







2025 Arlington National Cemetery "Tomb Trip" – 2 November 2025

We are arriving at Arlington an hour earlier than usual because of the side trip to the Steven F.
